About Peripheral Vascular Disease and Peripheral Arterial Disease

Peripheral Vascular Disease (PVD) is a blood circulation disorder that causes the blood vessels outside of your heart and brain to narrow, block or spasm. This can happen in your arteries or veins.

Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD) is a common condition in which narrowed arteries reduce blood flow to the arms or legs.

Don't ignore the signs and symptoms—PVD/PAD is preventable and treatable!

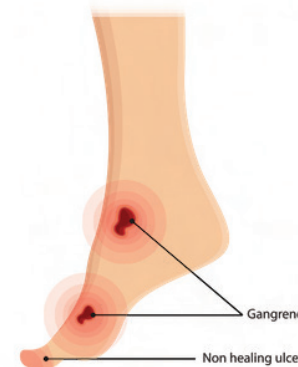
What to Look For

Symptoms

- Aching, cramping, or pain in your arm, legs, or buttock when walking
- Coolness or numbness in legs
- Discoloration of skin
- Shiny, thin skin on legs
- Hair loss on legs
- Wounds, ulcers that do not heal
- Slow growing toenails
- Swelling in legs

Risk Factors

- Diabetes
- Smoking cigarettes
- High blood pressure
- High cholesterol
- Obesity
- History of heart disease or stroke
- Family history of PAD
- 50 years or older
